



POST-OPERATIVE CARE FOLLOWING SURGERY.

- 1. Following surgery keep <u>several</u> gauze pads over the area with biting pressure. Change the gauze every hour until the bleeding stops.
- 2. Oozing of blood may persist on the first and second days following surgery. This may last longer if you are taking blood thinners.
- 3. The night of surgery swish with warm salt water. Continue doing this for at least two weeks. Rinse after each meal and before bed. (1/2 teaspoon of salt to a full glass of warm water) Brush the teeth normally. If you received a syringe, start irrigating 3 days after surgery. Irrigate the lower sockets after meals & before bed for several weeks until the site's have healed over all the way. Be sure to put the tip of the syringe down inside the site. (1/2 hydrogen peroxide and water) Do not use mouthwash.
- 4. If you are a smoker, **DO NOT SMOKE** for seven days.
- 5. Swelling around the mouth, cheeks, and eyes may follow some surgical procedures.

 This is a normal reaction and may persist 3-5 days. To minimize post-operative swelling, apply an ice pack to the outside of your face 20 minutes on and 20 minutes off for the <u>first 24 hours</u>.
- 6. To minimize post-op swelling and pain after the first 24hrs use a warm compress to the side of the jaw/face. Use this for several days.
- 7. For post-op discomfort; Alternating pain medication every 3 hours.
 - (1) Ibuprofen 600mgs
 - (2) Acetaminophen (Tylenol) 500mgs.
- 8. Infrequently, jaw pain, earache, and a bad taste may develop from 2-7 days following surgery, this is a result of food debris in the sockets. If you can not irrigate the socket please call the office to set up a post op appointment.
- 9. Sutures (Stitches) will dissolve in 3-7 days.
- 10. Resume medications the night of your procedure unless otherwise instructed by your medical doctor.
